1. Center for the Prevention and Treatment of Child Sexual Abuse (CPTSA) - International

Center for the Prevention and Treatment of Child Sexual Abuse is leading an international lecture series to respond to recent research that brings to light an imbalance of general services to our boys. More boys are abused than girls. The same number of boys as girls experience sexual abuse. Boys do not do as well in school. More males commit suicide than females. More men are in prison than women. Yet our programs and services tend to focus on empowering girls. We merely wish to balance the needed work on behalf of girls with work on behalf of boys. This lecture series wishes to begin earnest dialogue to meet this goal.

1.2 BLUE UMBRELLA INTERNATIONAL LECTURE SERIES 2022

The focus of my talk in this session was all about connecting with kids because, no matter what our function is—at work (in serving children) or at home—making connections with kids is essential especially in this digital age. This sharing was focused on helping people understand kids, teens, and their whole-brain development. The first section of this lecture provided an overview of children's current circumstances and the emotional development of the brain. This is followed by a review of techniques for connecting with children, and the second section describes how to establish a healing connection with survivors of child sexual abuse.

Workshop Abstract

Workshop title: Counseling the Abused

Level: Advanced

Speaker: Josevy A. Taguibao, RGC, LPT

Description:

What comes to mind when we hear the word abuse? Perhaps you can picture someone mistreating, harming, or using force against another person. As mental health professionals, you may have experienced handling clients who are victims or survivors of abuse, and it is probable that you will encounter someone in the future. In the Philippines, we have a high number of abuse cases and they come in a variety of forms. As duty bearers, we are someone who can support victims and survivors by performing our role as counselors. However, the profession currently provides limited training or programs for trauma-informed care practices. Generally, counselors acquire these skills when they come across a case and understand the necessity to equip themselves.

Because we are likely to encounter abused clients as mental health professionals in the school setting, this session aims to inspire practitioners and their institutions to embrace trauma-informed care practices. This program will include three sessions designed to improve the counselor’s professional skills and competencies.

We’ll first discuss the realities of abuse, "Ano Nga Ba?" A Reality Check of Abuse Cases in the Philippines. Further, in session 2, we will be discussing the essentials of counseling the abused or Paano Nga Ba? The Trauma-Informed Care Approach and Trauma-Informed Interventions for Abuse Survivors. Finally, the final session, titled "Tama ba?" aims to provide participants with an understanding of the importance of a Multidisciplinary Team Case Management Approach, the School's Protocol on Referral Mechanisms, and the Role of Counselors in Trauma-Informed Practices.
