II. Special Admissions Program

On *February 1, 2023*, Mabalacat City College President, Dr. Michelle Aguilar-Ong, signed a partnership with the City Social Welfare Development Office (CSWDO) Department Head Josephine B. Tanglao, RSW, to launch the MCC-UNA (First Generation Special Admissions Program) and I-Peace Program at the MCC Cultural Hall. These programs are part of the college's efforts to promote inclusivity and community engagement.

The MCC-UNA Program aims to provide automatic admission to first-generation students and support them through support group sessions,



activities, and resources that address their unique experiences and challenges. Any applicant whose parents did not complete a 4-year college or university degree can qualify for automatic admission slots, regardless of other family member's level of education.



On the other hand, the **I-Peace Program** recognizes and fulfills the rights of indigenous peoples (IPs) residing in the community. It provides automatic admission slots for IPs who wish to pursue tertiary education, promoting equitable access to a college education.

To ensure that IP students are aware of the program and receive support in their application, MCC Kayantabe, the college's advocacy arm, collaborated with Mabalacat Technical

Vocational Senior High School to identify interested IP students in pursuing higher education. The Aeta students and their parents were given an orientation about the I-PEACE program and other support programs under the I-PEACE CONNECT.

After the orientation, the students were given a campus tour at MCC. The event was attended by Mr. Jaypee Quioc, Guidance Designate of MTV-SHS, Dr. Josevy A. Taguibao, Assistant Vice President for SAID, Ms. Carol R. Arboleda, Manager of MCC Kayantabe, and the entire Kayantabe team. While on March 9, 2023, MCC OVPGROW staff went to MTV-SHS to assist some IP students with their online application and discuss the college's programs to encourage them to enroll.

In conclusion, Mabalacat City College's launch of the MCC-UNA and I-Peace Programs demonstrates its unwavering commitment to providing equal access to higher education and promoting inclusivity in the community. The college recognizes the unique challenges that first-



generation students and indigenous peoples face. These programs aim to support and provide them with opportunities to succeed academically and improve their quality of living. Overall, these efforts signify MCC's continuous efforts to create a diverse and supportive community in higher education.

III. Opening of Admissions for AY 2023-2024

A. Presentation and Approval of the College Admissions Guidelines and Policies for AY 2023-2024

Last *January 20, 2023*, Dr. Josevy A. Taguibao, LPT, RGC, presented the proposed Admissions Policies during the Academic Council Meeting, which included the discussion on College or program's enrollment capacity and applicants' residency where applicants who are non-residents of Mabalacat City shall be considered provided that they competitively meet the top rank among the applicants and where further deliberations may ensue.

Only applicants who qualify with complete and satisfactory admission requirements shall be eligible for the College Entrance Examination (CEE).



Those who satisfy the competency-based qualifications set by the program or/and institutes shall be admitted and ranked following each program's carrying capacity. Institute Interview where the Admissions Officer shall endorse for institute interview the student applicants for the Institute of Hotel and Tourism Management and Bachelor of Physical Education. For the rest of the programs, only wait-listed students shall be endorsed for an interview at the dean's discretion.

Lastly, the proposal on adopting standardized testing for MCC College Entrance Exam was presented. Standardized testing was carefully considered because the college recognizes the potential of every senior high school graduate from various schools by giving everyone a chance to apply at MCC.

A presentation of competencies was also included. The competencies set per program vary depending on each program's required competencies which were reviewed by the Support for Academic and Institutional Development and Academic Council in consultation with relevant members of Admissions. The set of competencies per program that was completed last January 19, 2022 was presented. The following competencies measured by the CEE are: Verbal Reasoning, Numerical Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning, Perceptual and Speed Accuracy, Mechanical Reasoning, Space Relations, Spelling, and Language Usage.



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B. Virtual Information Meeting

The Admissions Office supported the conduct of the Mabalacat City College *Virtual Information Meeting* headed by the AVP for Partnership and Linkages, Sir Kevin Peralta. The office also acknowledged the efforts and dedication of the Crimson Honors, who helped the senior high school students virtually navigate the MCC campus life.

This shows that the College not only has campus tours at MCC, but we also conduct virtual college information sessions.



The activity has helped the attendees walk away from the session confident in their next steps toward college application. It was also their chance to ask specific questions and learn everything they could from our student ambassadors about Admissions, Financial Aid, College Life, and The Honors Program from the comfort of their homes.

C. Opening of Online College Application

On *February 06, 2023*, MCC Admissions Office posted the opening of College Online Applications for incoming First-Year and Transferee students for AY 2023-2024.



D. Onsite Submission of Printed Application and Required Documents







On *February 7, 2023*, aspiring members of the Crimson Tribe lined up at the MCC Admissions Office for the submission of their requirements, marking the second day of the College Application for Academic Year 2023-2024. The applicants patiently waited for their turn for the submissions of documents and to be oriented on the necessary steps for MCC college admission.



E. Verification of submitted Documents

The Admissions Office verified the submitted printed application forms and their admissions application requirements.



Upon verification of the student's submitted documents, a total of 3,370 applicants were called and sent an SMS to their phone numbers and informed them of their Admissions concerns,



such as lacking necessary documents and wrong information with their college application, and requested them to visit the Admissions Office and comply with the requirements.

For those student applicants with incomplete documents, the office has reached out to them through phone calls and asked them to submit the requirements needed, such as the following:

For New Students:

- Printed Application form with signature
- Scanned and printed copy of 2x2 formal picture with white background
- Form 138 original and scanned copy (1st semester and 2nd semester of either Grade 11 or Grade Senior High School Card)
- Voter's ID/Voter's Slip (Student or Parent) or National ID / or any two permanent IDs indicating the Address of the student/parents (Mabalacat-Residents Only)
- One (1) Long Brown Envelope

For Transferees:

- Printed Application form with signature
- Scanned and printed copy of 2x2 formal picture with white background
- Original and scanned Copy of Grades/Transcript of Records from previous/current institution
- Voter's ID/Voter's Slip (Student or Parent) or National ID / or any two permanent IDs indicating the Address of the student/parents (Mabalacat-Residents Only)
- One (1) Long Brown Envelope

IV. Admissions Responsive Services

The College Admissions office staff promptly assisted and passionately answered inquiries received from incoming first-year students and transferees for the Academic Year 2023 – 2024. From February 06, 2023 to December 29, 2023, following the releasing of the College Entrance Exam results period, update for the upcoming opening of Admissions for Academic Year 2024-2025 students have been raising concerns thru SMS or Messenger accounts about their schedule of CEE, submissions of Application forms, failure to submit their applications, change of courses, and incomplete requirements. Others had encoded information erroneously such as, no email received, not included on the posted schedule for CEE, etc.

In response, the Admissions assistants promptly replied to their inquiries by sending messages and/or calling the concerned applicant. The table below shows the number of students served by the admissions office from February 06, 2023 to December 29, 2023.


Overall, there were **2828** emailed sent to applicants, *3165* served applicants thru phone calls, *4420* served office inquiries, and *2009* online inquiries during the period. The number of online and onsite inquiries was generally consistent throughout the period. The most common inquiries from applicants concerns, the availability of slots, changing their residency status, and retrieving original documents needed for the enrollment process.



V. Admissions Report (Application Period)

A total of <u>3,370</u> applications were received during the application period from February 6, 2023, to March 27, 2023. A total of <u>3027</u>, were verified and encoded, while <u>343</u> were asked to resubmit their application form and comply with the required documents.

Number of Applications Per Institute




The data shows the number of applicants per institute for college admissions. Among the four institutes, *IBCE has the highest number of applicants with 1,480* applicants, followed by *IHTM with 979 applicants*, and *ITE with 775 applicants*. The institute with the lowest number of applicants is *IAS with only 136 applicants*.

The data suggests that there is a considerable variation in the number of applicants per institute for college admissions. It is important for the college to analyze this data and determine the factors that contribute to the popularity of certain institutes and programs. This can help the school to make informed decisions about admissions policies, program offerings, and marketing strategies to attract more applicants to their institutes.



Number of Application Per Program




Meanwhile, the table below shows data on the number of applicants for each program for college admissions. The program with the highest number of applicants is BSIT, with 876 applicants, followed by BSHM, 546 applicants, and BSTM, with 433 applicants.

On the other hand, the programs with the lowest number of applicants are ABH, with 34 applicants; BECED, with 32 applicants; and BTVTED, with 31 applicants.

Overall, the data indicates a significant variation in the number of applicants per program, with some programs being more popular than others. This information can be helpful for the college to help them make informed decisions about program offerings and admissions policies on slot availability.




Number of Mabalacat and Non-Mabalacat Residents



The data is categorized into "Mabalacat" and "Non-Mabalacat" applicants for academic year 2023-2024. Given that the institution is a local college of Mabalacat City, priority is accorded to local citizens of the city. However, as a community college, MCC warmly welcomes non-Mabalacat residents to apply for college admissions, contingent upon their performance in the college entrance exam and the availability of slots. With a total of 3,370 applicants, 2,284 individuals, constituting 67.77% of the total, are from *Mabalacat*, while 1,086 individuals, representing 32.22% of the total, are college applicants from *non-Mabalacat* residencies. The applicant's place of residence was considered a crucial factor in the admission process.

The presented data indicates that there were 76 verified applicants for the MCC-UNA program and 15 verified applicants for the I-Peace program. These figures offer valuable insights into the number of eligible applicants granted in these special admission programs.



V. College Entrance Exam (CEE) Verification and Scheduling Update

On March 22, 2023, Mabalacat City College (MCC) successfully conducted the verification and scheduling for the 3rd-6th batches of applicants for the College Entrance Exam (CEE), spanning from April to May. The scheduling for the 3rd batch occurred from April 25 to May 10, 2023, the 4th batch from May 11 to May 15, 2023, and the 6th batch from May 16 to June 5, 2023. During these exams, stringent guidelines were observed to ensure a standardized testing environment.

Efficient communication channels were utilized to inform applicants of their respective testing schedules, utilizing their registered addresses and phone numbers. Furthermore, to enhance accessibility, the schedules were prominently displayed at key locations: MCC Main Gate 2, the MCC Admissions and Information Delivery Office, and the MCC-Admissions page. As an additional measure, applicants were advised to take note of essential details such as seat number, scheduled day and time, and LRN (Learner Reference Number). This aims to provide strategic approach applicants with clear and convenient access to their testing information, contributing to well-organized and transparent examination process.

On *March 4, 2023* Admissions Office posted the link of the 1st batch of applicants with complete and verified

application requirements (February 6 to 17, 2923) and scheduled for College Entrance Exam from March 6 to March 27, 2023.

While **on** *March 23*, *2023*, the link for the 2nd batch of applicants with complete and verified application requirements (February 20 to March 21, 2023) are scheduled for the College Entrance Exam for April 3 to 20, 2023.

On *March 14, 2023*, MCC conducted the first batch of verified applicants of the College Entrance Exam (CEE) from February 6-17. The first batch of CEE was scheduled for March 14-31, 2023, and standard guidelines during the college entrance exam (CEE) was observed.





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The applicants were informed of their testing schedules through their registered email addresses and The contact numbers. schedules were also made available on the MCC-Admissions page and were posted **MCC** at the Admissions and Information Delivery Office and MCC Main-Gate 2 to ensure that the applicants have easy access to the information. They were also instructed to take note of their LRN, scheduled date and time, and seat number.

To avoid any inconvenience, they were advised to arrive promptly at 8:00 AM for the MORNING SCHEDULE and 1:00 PM for

the AFTERNOON SCHEDULE. The applicants were directed to proceed to MCC Main (Dolores) - Gate 2 for the attendance signing before heading to the testing venue at the MCC Cultural Hall, 2nd Floor. To ensure proper identification, applicants were instructed to wear a facemask, white T-shirt or school uniform, and present their ID. They were also reminded to bring a Black ball pen and pencil, pre-packed snacks, and drinks. Applicants were strongly advised to only being necessary items.

3. Probationary

A total of *109 admitted applicants* were initially placed under *Probationary status* as they did not meet the program's criteria. Reconsideration for this status was based on CEE ranking and the availability of program slots. The Bachelor of Science in Customs Administration had the highest number of Probationary applicants, with 30 individuals, followed by the Bachelor of Science in Office Administration with 23. Other programs had varying numbers of Probationary applicants, with some having none.

To support their learning, additional assessments, evaluations, and preparatory learning activities may be introduced. Consequently, names were endorsed to *Academic Affairs* to provide an early intervention program. These initiatives aim to offer opportunities for applicants to demonstrate their suitability and capabilities during the probationary period.

4. Sponsored Admissions

A total of 38 admitted applicants under Sponsored Admission are on probationary status primarily because they did not initially qualify. Their reconsideration was solely due to external sponsorship or exceptional circumstances. The Bachelor of Science in Office Administration has the highest number, with nine applicants reconsidered, compared to other programs such as Bachelor of Secondary Education (Major in Science and Major in Social Studies), Bachelor of Science in Hospitality Management, and others.

Interestingly, some programs, namely Bachelor of Science in Biology, Bachelor of Physical Education, Bachelor of Secondary Education (Major in English and Major in Filipino), Bachelor of Science in Customs Administration, Bachelor of Science in Information Technology, and Bachelor of Science in Management Accounting, have no admitted applicants under Sponsored Admission.

These applicants were given an opportunity to demonstrate their aptitude during the probationary period. In order to enhance their learning, we may introduce additional assessments, evaluations, and preparatory learning activities. Subsequently, names have been forwarded to Academic Affairs to implement an early intervention program. These initiatives are designed to provide opportunities for applicants to showcase their suitability and capabilities during the probationary period.

5. Provisional Acceptance

A total of 114 admitted applicants under Provisional Acceptance are individuals who applied but did not pass the College Entrance Exam (CEE) for their chosen program. This category of acceptance is designated for applicants required to fill the available slots allotted for CEE Passers. Their approval was granted after a thorough reconsideration of their CEE results, ranking, and the availability of the program. Notably, the Bachelor of Science in Hospitality Management has the highest number of accepted applicants under this category. In contrast, programs such as the Bachelor of Physical Education, Bachelor of Secondary Education Major in Filipino, Bachelor of Science in Tourism Management have fewer applicants, and the Bachelor of Science in Customs Administration has none.

To further enrich their educational experience, supplementary assessments, evaluations, and preparatory learning activities may be introduced. As a follow-up, the names have been submitted to Academic Affairs to execute an early intervention program. These measures aim to create avenues for applicants to demonstrate their aptitude and capabilities throughout the probationary period.



6. Mabalacat and Non Mabalacat Residents (admitted)


The data is categorized into "Mabalacat" and "Non-Mabalacat" admitted first year students for admitted first-year students in AY 2023-2024. Given that the institution is a local college of Mabalacat City, priority is accorded to local citizens of the city. However, as a community college, MCC warmly welcomes non-Mabalacat residents to apply for college admissions, contingent upon their performance in the college entrance exam and the availability of slots. With a total of 964 admitted first-year students, 790 individuals, constituting 81.9 % of the total, are from Mabalacat, while 174 individuals, representing 18.1 % of the total, are college applicants from non-Mabalacat residencies. The applicant's place of residence was considered a crucial factor in the admission process.

XI. SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

A. Academic Support

1. Support for the Registrar Office During the Enrollment Process of Incoming First-Year and Transferee Students

Between August 22, 2023, and September 11, 2023, the Admissions staff actively collaborated with the College Registrar to address minor irregularities, such as sudden changes in program selection that did not meet the ITE program standards for transferees. This led to discrepancies with the reserved and confirmed slots.

Additionally, the Admissions office played a crucial role by providing the College Registrar with responses to common inquiries found in the Frequently Asked Questions section. This ensured a smooth flow of information during the enrollment period.

During enrollment, some students contested their residency status, while others failed to submit supporting documents for their claims. To address these issues, the admission office issued Certifications of Residency or Non-Residency for students who had successfully changed their residency status.



As the scheduled enrollment date concluded, the Admissions staff diligently monitored the number of enrolled students compared to the expected enrollees. Students listed but not enrolled on their scheduled date were proactively contacted via calls and/or SMS for verification. In instances where students did not proceed with enrollment, the Admissions staff promptly opened the vacated slots and offered them to those on the waitlist.

A. Official Number of Endorsed Late Enrollees to Registrar

Total of 171 late enrollees were processed and submitted to the Registrar's office as an addendum to the original passers to occupy vacant slots. These slots were initially reserved for individuals who had confirmed their enrollment but did not proceed with the process.

The distribution of late enrollees across institutes is as follows:

- Institute of Teacher Education: 60 late enrollees
- Institute of Business and Computing Education: 56 late enrollees
- Institute of Hospitality and Tourism Management: 38 late enrollees
- Institute of Art and Science: 17 late enrollees

2. Number of Endorsed Students for Early Academic Intervention

Early academic intervention programs play a crucial role in supporting students facing various challenges during their college journey. As seen in Figure 2, the pie chart provides an in-depth overview of admitted students and their diverse admission categories within Mabalacat City College. Understanding that not all admitted students are College Entrance Exam (CEE) passers, the Admissions Office has implemented special admission programs and reconsiderations for those with unique qualifications.

Recognizing the diverse needs of students, the institution acknowledges the importance of early academic intervention to ensure a successful transition into the college environment. This section outlines the statistical breakdown of students participating in various admission categories and highlights the institutional commitment to providing tailored support for their academic success. On September 5, 2023, the AVP SAID initiated the endorsement of the list of students admitted under special circumstances to the Office of the Vice President of Academic Affairs. This proactive approach aligns with the college's dedication to fostering a supportive and inclusive learning environment for all students



3. Special Academic Council Meeting

Finalization of Admissions Opening for Academic Year 2024-2025

On December 5, 2023, the AVPAA and Office of AVP for Support for Academic Institutional and Development conducted a Special Academic Council Meeting through Microsoft Teams. The primary agenda was to finalize the opening date of admissions for the upcoming Academic Year 2024-2025. After thorough deliberation, it was collectively agreed that the proposed schedule for the commencement of admissions would be from December 12, 2023, to February 12, 2024 which will be included in the academic resolution.



Key Discussions:

- 1. College Deans' Confirmation: The College Deans actively participated in the meeting, confirming and verifying their respective institute policies. This collaborative effort ensures that each institute is well-prepared to navigate the upcoming admissions process efficiently.
- 2. Clarification of Admission Slots: A pivotal aspect of the meeting involved the clarification of the required number of students for admissions in each program. This detailed clarification aims to provide transparency and aligns with our commitment to a fair and inclusive admissions process.

Next Steps: As we move forward with the finalized schedule and clarified policies, it is imperative for all stakeholders, including institute staff and prospective applicants, to be well-informed. The collaboration and commitment demonstrated in this meeting pave the way for a smooth and well-organized admissions period.

B. Student Life Supportive Activities

1. Proposal for UNA (First Generation) Student and Parent Orientation 2023-2024

Upon the submission of the proposal letter from the AVP Support for Academic and Institutional Development, Dr. Taguibao, and with approval from the College President, Dr. Ong,



the proposed Student and Parent Orientation for UNA members underwent extensive discussion with Ms. Florient Non, the Assistant Vice President for Student Life. In her capacity as AVP SAID, Dr. Taguibao wholeheartedly pledged the full support of the department to this significant initiative.

This orientation seeks to offer valuable insights to parents regarding their privileges and responsibilities as UNA members, supporting their son/daughter's educational journey towards earning a bachelor's degree at the institution. Acknowledging the importance of parental involvement, this activity is expected to strengthen student-parent relationships and enhance the overall quality of learning, fostering increased confidence in the achievement of educational goals.

2. Mental Health and RACE Against Suicide Roll-out Training for School-wide Suicide Prevention

On November 17, 2023, the AVP for Support for Academic and Institutional Development, in collaboration with the Guidance Services Unit, orchestrated a comprehensive Mental Health Seminar and RACE Against Suicide Training, marking a significant stride in school-wide suicide prevention. The theme, "Suicide Prevention Begins with All of Us," aimed to enhance awareness and understanding of mental health issues among teachers, staff, and students.





Training Objectives

Dr. Josevy A. Taguibao, the primary facilitator and speaker, dedicated efforts towards training college instructors, guidance designates, and selected personnel as gatekeepers. The training sought to equip them with the skills necessary to recognize and assist individuals at risk of suicide. The overarching goal was to prepare school staff to effectively act as gatekeepers, managing and referring learners-at-risk for appropriate assistance.



C. INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

1. CHED UNIFAST

Reported to CHED Unifast, the current enrollment status highlights the successful admission of 964 applicants who passed the admission test and are currently enrolled. In addition, 650 applicants who passed chose not to enroll, and 1214 applicants did not meet the admission requirements.

These figures provide an overview of the admissions process, reflecting the number of applicants who took the admissions test, their outcomes, and the enrollment status.



2. Community-Driven Admissions Activity: MCC UNA Program Presentation at CDC Clark

A collaborative initiative unfolded as representatives from the Mabalacat City College (MCC) Kayantabe, Admissions Office (represented by Dr. Josevy A. Taguibao), and the Clark Development Corporation (CDC) convened for a productive discussion at CDC Clark. The primary focus was the presentation of MCC's Special Admission Programs, particularly emphasizing services tailored for first-generation students and Indigenous Peoples (IPs). This session served as an opportunity to explore potential partnerships and delve into the prospects of offering specialized



educational services. The MCC team showcased a diverse array of programs, sparking a dialogue that addressed crucial topics essential for active participation and the co-creation of shared success. The engagement aimed at fostering collaboration that could lead to breakthroughs in providing accessible and tailored educational opportunities for the community.

3. I-Peace Connect Scholars (Yokohama Tires Philippines Inc.)



Mabalacat City College's I-PEACE Connect Scholars, in collaboration with Yokohama Tires Philippines Inc. (YTPI), were recipients of hygiene kits and school supplies. This annual initiative is part of YTPI's Brigada Eskwela program. The Admissions Office actively participated and supported the event on September 27, 2023.



XV. ARCHIVING AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT

A. Shredding of Spoiled Testing Materials

On November 6-10, 2023, the Admissions Personnel sorted, decluttered and shredded spoiled test materials to safeguard all the damaged test booklets, answer sheets and other forms. In decluttering and shredding papers helps to sustain the cleanliness and proper arrangement of all the documents in preparation for upcoming opening of Admissions in Academic Year 2024-2025.



B. Archiving of Submitted Requirements Academic Year 2023-2024

In a collaborative meeting with the Quality Assurance Office on September 12, 2023, crucial decisions were reached concerning the systematic archiving of admission files. The consensus was to retain application forms within the Admissions Office as active files for a period of one year. Furthermore, a dedicated hard drive will be provided by the Quality Assurance team specifically for saving scanned application forms, excluding attachments, since the Management Information System (MIS) already possesses copies of the attachments. The existing application forms will be meticulously organized and stored in labeled boxes under the supervision of a Quality Assurance officer to ensure a methodical and well-documented archiving process.

XVI. Program Implementation Review of Admissions 2023-2024 and Discussion of Admissions Policies for Academic Year 2024-2025




Background:

In a Special Academic Council Meeting on November 20, 2023, Dr. Josevy A. Taguibao, LPT, RGC, along with Ms. Camille Esguerra, Admission Assistant and Ms. Rinalyn Alimpolo, Testing Assistant presented the Admissions Policies. The discussions were multifaceted, delving into critical areas such as the college's enrollment capacity, residency requirements, and a comprehensive review of the recently concluded Admissions for 2023-2024.

Special Admissions Programs:

The continuation of special admissions programs, including UNA and I-Peace, remains in effect, underscoring our commitment to providing diverse pathways for student inclusion and success.

Residency Considerations:



Admission Requirements:

Only applicants meeting the complete and satisfactory admission requirements, defined by standard and predetermined criteria set by the office, will be eligible for the College Entrance Examination (CEE).

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Competency-Based Qualifications:

Admission decisions will hinge on program-specific competency-based qualifications. These competencies, reviewed by the Support for Academic and Institutional Development and Academic Council on November 5, 2023, provide a robust framework for evaluating applicants.

Institute Interviews:

Certain programs necessitate interviews, including the Institute of Hotel and Tourism Management, Bachelor of Physical Education, Bachelor of Secondary Major in English, Bachelor of Science in Information Technology, Bachelor of Science in Customs Administration, and Bachelor of Science in Management Accounting. For other programs, waitlisted students may be endorsed for interviews at the dean's discretion.



Standardized Testing:

The MCC College Entrance Exam (CEE) will continue to incorporate standardized testing. This decision is driven by the goal of offering equal opportunities to senior high school graduates from diverse schools, ensuring a fair and unbiased evaluation process.

Competencies Measured by CEE:

The CEE assesses competencies in Verbal Reasoning, Numerical Reasoning, and Abstract Reasoning. Applicants achieving an AVERAGE rating in these competencies will be recommended for an interview.

Individual Admissions Protocols: To address specific concerns and nuances in the admissions process for each institute, a collective decision was made. Every institute is tasked with formulating its unique admissions protocol, inclusive of detailed guidelines, an interview matrix with scoring guidelines, and a table of specification. Should an institute opt for an additional institutional exam, providing details on its validity and reliability is advised, subject to subsequent review and approval.

Timely Submission:

Timely submission is critical for adherence to the individualized admissions protocols. Failure to submit within the specified timeframe would result in following the standard admissions procedure outlined by the office.



In conclusion, these refined policies underscore our commitment to a fair, transparent, and inclusive admissions process, fostering an environment where every applicant has the opportunity to showcase their potential.

XXII. Opening of Admissions for Academic Year 2024-2025

On December 12, 2023, the Office of Admissions initiated the online application process for Academic Year 2024-2025. Subsequently, all applicants proceeded to MCC Main Campus Gate 2 to submit the hard copy of their application forms and other requirements through a drop box, with the security personnel aiding the admissions staff in managing the influx of applicants. Moreover, the admissions team consistently revised and enhanced the processes, flows, and FAQs to ensure that every applicant remained well-informed and ready for their prospective journey as part of the Crimson Tribe in the future. As part of this ongoing effort, it was updated that applicants could submit their printed application forms during their scheduled entrance exam to streamline the admissions
