II. Rationale:

First aid is essential in ensuring that a proper initial care will be provided during a medical emergency. However, poor communities have insufficient knowledge and access to the first aid necessities. If this will be continuously neglected, it can result to lower rate of survival, particularly within the community, due to absence of first aid during an emergency.

As a solution to this, we will conduct a two-hour training and awareness workshop, aiming to provide students the proper knowledge and skills necessary in performing first aid. This training will strengthen the participants' core values, encouraging them to willingly help those who are in need, spread awareness and knowledge to further encourage other people, particularly the youth, to learn the methods of first aid.

A two-hour training strengthens participants' core values and equips them with the skills to conduct medical first aid.
