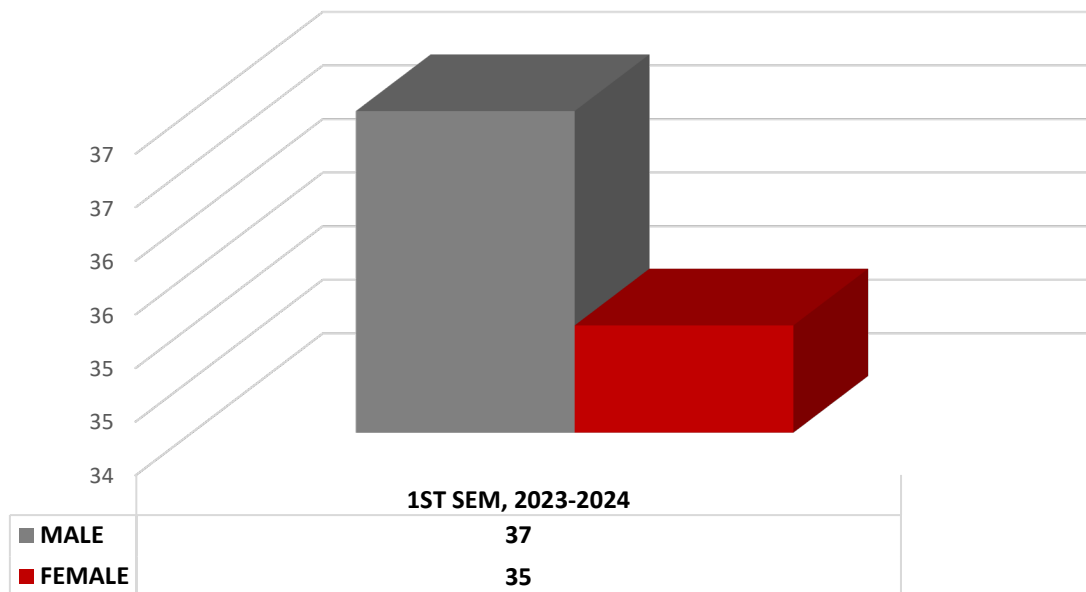
MCC UNA: THE FIRST-GENERATION ADMISSIONS SPECIAL PROGRAM

MCC strongly hopes to provide the opportunity for everyone, especially first-generation college students, to earn a Bachelor's Degree. To support this, on February 1st, 2023, MCC formed a partnership with the City Social Welfare Development Office to launch MCC UNA (First-Generation Special Admissions Program).

MCC UNA is a dedicated admissions program designed to secure college access for first-generation college applicants whose parents have not completed a 4-year college degree, regardless of the educational background of other family members.

In its first year of implementation, the program welcomed **67** students across a range of programs, 32 of whom were female and 35 male. This milestone represents MCC's ongoing commitment to expanding educational access, supporting student success, and paving the way for a new generation of college graduates.

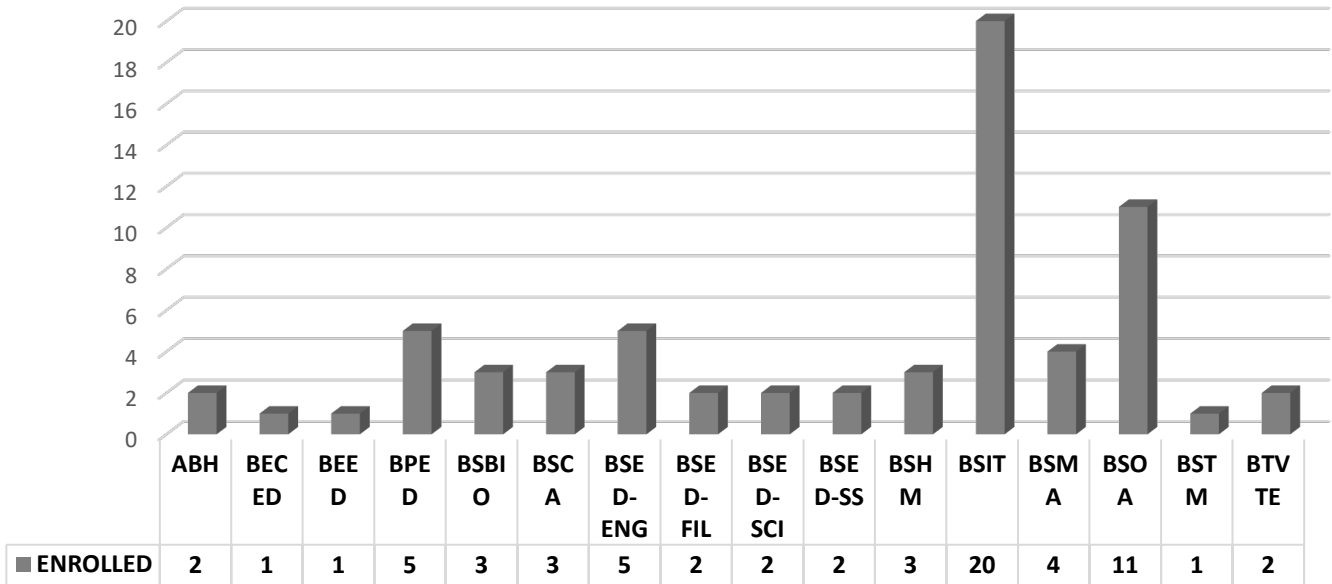

The chart shows enrollment data for the UNA Program for A.Y. 2023-2024. BSIT has the highest enrollment with 20 students, followed by BSOA with 11. Programs like BPEd and BSA show moderate interest, while several fields, including BECEd, BEEEd, BSTM, and BTVTE, have very low enrollment (1-3 students). This data suggests varied interest across programs, with strong demand for IT and Office Administration.
