Re: Household Income Analytics for Academic Year 2021-2022

The data collection process drew from the Mabalacat City College admission system, collected during the admission process. As Table 1 illustrates, this data collection initiative commenced in 2020, leaving a data gap for students who had enrolled before that year. In total, we successfully gathered 1,663 records out of the 3,790 total students.

Based on the collected data, the Analytics Office computed household information and established income brackets, as presented in Table 1. Furthermore, a comparative analysis was conducted, aligning the outcomes with both the student population and the data collected, shedding light on any disparities or trends within the college's demographic landscape.

In Table 2, we present the percentage of students falling below the poverty line, as determined by the income brackets established for the academic year 2021-2022. These income brackets are based on the official poverty threshold defined by the Philippines Statistics Authority (PSA) in their 2021 Full Year Official Poverty Statistics. The table provides insights into the financial well-being of our student population in relation to the PSA's threshold. It offers a comprehensive view of the proportion of students within each income bracket who are below the poverty line, helping us to better understand the economic diversity and challenges faced by our students. This data serves as a crucial foundation for formulating strategies and initiatives aimed at addressing the financial needs of our student body.

The data presented in Table 1 and Table 2 shed light on the financial profiles of our student population at Mabalacat City College during the academic year 2021-2022. Notably, 43.88% of the collected data falls within the income brackets examined, with the majority of this group residing below the poverty line. In fact, the data reveals that 69.21% of all students collected data are categorized as low-income earners, with only a minuscule fraction exceeding the poverty threshold.

It is imperative to acknowledge that this snapshot is based on partial data, and the actual figures could be even more striking if we had a complete dataset. These findings underscore the economic challenges faced by a significant portion of our student body, reinforcing the importance of tailored support and financial assistance programs to ensure that all learners have an equitable opportunity to pursue their education effectively.
