

Figure 1. Where did you learn about this event? "Check all that applies


Where did you learn about this event? *Check all that applies 45 responses



Based on the figure above, most of the participants are being oriented about the event through the help of ISC/Student Organizations with a 46.7% followed by social media platforms and directed by SSC.

































































- To promote socialization to other class mayors.




An appreciation Day to all Mayors'







Towards Accountable Leadership"








PROGRAM DESIGN

"Every Blood Donor is a Hero"

I. RATIONALE

According to Republic Act 7719, also known as the National Blood Services Act of 1994, Section 2 subsection a, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote and encourage voluntary blood donation by the citizenry and to instill public consciousness of the principle that blood donation is a humanitarian act.

Also included in the Section 2 subsection c of this act the provision to provide for adequate, safe, affordable and equitable distribution of supply of blood and blood products.

Stipulated in the Section 2 subsection e of this act the policy of the State to teach the benefits and rationale of voluntary blood donation in the existing health subjects of the formal education system in all public and private schools, in the elementary, high school and college levels as well as the non-formal education system.

As per CHED Memorandum No. 09 s. 2013, Section 27 entitled Health Services subsection 27.1, the Higher Education Institution shall provide primary health care services administered by licensed medical, dental and allied professionals to all students.

In compliance with this, the Mabalacat City College Supreme Student Council (MCCSSC) with the collaboration of the Mabalacat City College Health Services Unit, Mabalacat City Health Office, Pampanga Provincial Health Office and Jose B. Lingad Memorial General Hospital will be conducting an activity entitled "Every Blood Donor is a Hero" on May 23, 2022. The activity aims to enhance the awareness of society about the importance of blood donation services to prolong and save the life of Filipino Citizens.



- 3.4. Coordinate with the Strategic Communication Office to cover and share the program on the Mabalacat City College Official Facebook Page.

4. Strategies for the Local Government Unit of Mabalacat City


