


Report on the Total Number of Working Students at Mabalacat City College (2022-2024)

This report provides an analysis of the total number of working students enrolled at Mabalacat City College (MCC) over a three-year period, from 2022 to 2024. The data reveals trends in the number of students balancing employment with their academic responsibilities, highlighting potential shifts in student demographics or socio-economic factors affecting enrollment.

The following data reflects the total number of working students at Mabalacat City College for the years 2022, 2023, and 2024:



In 2022, the total number of working students was 935. This figure dropped by about 16% in 2023, with only 784 students balancing work and school. Several factors may have contributed to this decline, including lingering economic effects of the pandemic, fewer job opportunities, or shifts in students' educational choices.

However, in 2024, the number of working students rebounded slightly to 835, a modest increase of 6.5% from the previous year. This recovery could indicate a stabilization in the job market and a potential adjustment in the college's academic offerings, such as more flexible scheduling or online learning options, which may have helped students manage both work and studies more effectively.
