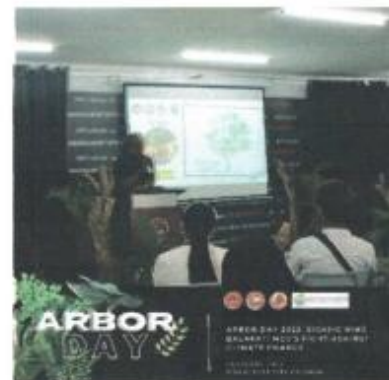

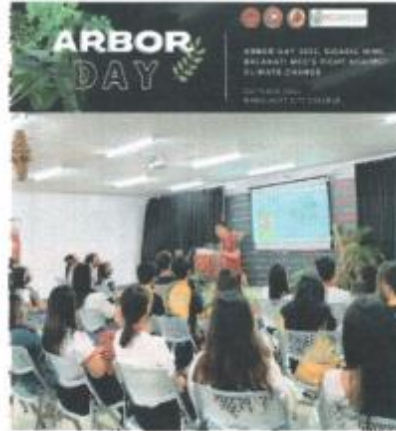

Series of markings of Balakat trees surrounding three (3) barangays of Mabalacat City: Poblacion, Mamalitang, and Mangalit, has started today.

It is the policy of Mabalacat City College (MCC) to carry out concrete actions geared toward the preservation and protection of the history of the city of Mabalacat. One of the significant missions is the propagation, preservation, and protection of the local Balakat trees found within the communities of Mabalacat City.

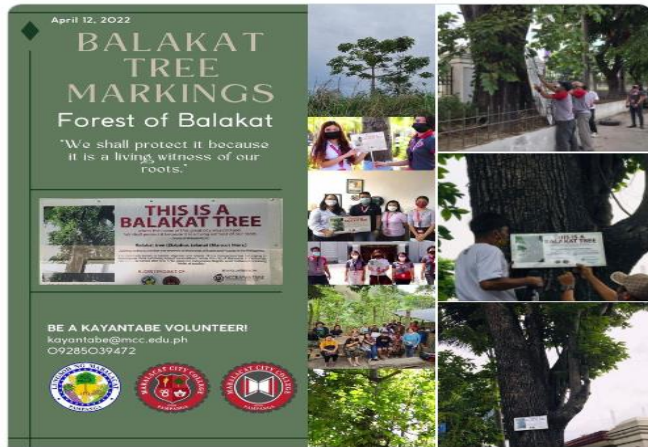
In recognition of Balakat trees, MCC is standing on its moral obligation to identify these, recognize their significance, and protect these trees.

Moreover, this policy is implemented in accordance with the Republic Act. 10176; reviving the observance of Arbor Day by authorizing the local government units the responsibilities for celebrating the day for tree planting as an annual event.

The purpose of the activity is to protect the Balakat trees and at the same time the Mabalacat culture, which serves as a living reminder of our ancestors. The Balakat tree is now endangered and necessitates immediate action to ensure its conservation through Balakat tree markings and annual Arbor Day activities.

Hence, the MCC Community Extension, also known as Kayantabe, has lined up a series of activities about climate change mitigation and environmental protection and awareness during April. One of these is the marking of Balakat trees (Ziziphus Talana).
