COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will expose students about the history, culture, and arts of Mabalacat. It will also instill to the students the value of nationalism of Mabalacat City College. The course is a general survey of history of the Mabalaqueños from the pre-colonial times up to the present. It also includes a discussion on the present development and possible scenarios on the past events as the historical circumstances. Its objective being – to re-introduce the history of Mabalacat Town to all Mabalacat City College students; to awaken in them a sense of belonging to the town they call home; to anchor everyone with a sense of pride at knowing their own hometown and its roots and development.
